The year to date has been a successful one for the charity in that we received a much better rate for the summer grazing, the best we have had for a number of years. Better still, we have received a similar amount for this year too, at £75 per acre.

On the not so good side however, there has been a considerable delay in the payments we get from the government to protect the wildlife, fawner and flora in our part of the upper Waveney valley. This is a scheme administered by the government that requires us to manage the marshes in a way to enhance the environment, for which we should receive an extra payment. Along with many other land-owners, we are still awaiting our cheque.

As usual, at Christmas, we provided a payment to the Alburgh trustees of £600, and payment to the Senior Citizens of Wortwell of £25 each in the form of Co-op shopping vouchers.

Its always difficult for the Trustees to identify our Senior Citizens as some either move out or move into the village, in spite of advertising in "The Mardler".
