MEMORIAL BENCH PLACED IN TRIBUTE TO PAULINE ALLEN



Earlier this week, a small gathering attended the ribbon cutting of the memorial bench by Pauline's partner, Murray Gray.

Pauline taught music in schools in Southampton and London before moving to South Norfolk in 1986 as Advisory Teacher of Music. Her job involved giving primary school teachers the confidence and resources to

teach music. In the 1990s she crossed the border to do the same job across Suffolk primary schools.

Pauline ran the Wortwell Youth Club for 5 years in the 1990s and later chaired the Wortwell Play Association tasked with acquiring new play equipment. She was an expert in applying for grants and raised over £25,000 to achieve the younger age play equipment you see today.

Thank you to Damien Kerslake for installing the bench on the playing field.



REPORT OF CHAIRMAN OF TRUSTEES WORTWELL COMMUNITY CENTRE 2022-2023

Prior to drafting this report, I looked through previous years' reports and minutes of our Trustees meetings over the year. This reminded me just how much is involved in the upkeep of the building and of the massive amount of work involved to simply keep it running and fit for purpose. Also apparent as a constant is the drive and dedication of the Trustees volunteers and Louise (our cleaner).

Every year I have said that despite outside factors (lockdown and pandemic and this year's cost of living crisis, specifically energy costs) we continue to operate successfully and have coped with these pressures. Things have got better and the Community Centre is in good order and looking forward to the future with anticipation.

During the past year, we have dealt with storm damage and repair to the roof, general maintenance, plumbing and electrical work on an ongoing basis, several acts of petty vandalism, sorted out problems with water meter billing

We have bought: Walkie talkies (for events and emergency planning), defibrillator (now situated inside the front door), laptop (for administration), the CORE website is in the process of being updated, bar refurbishment is ongoing, and work is in hand for refurbishment to provide decent office facilities.

The Community Centre has been well attended by our many clubs and visitors to weddings parties and events. We have regular Friday social nights, quizzes and bingo (many thanks Keith, Charlie, Graham, Lua, Tina, Alison, Trustees and other helpers).

Two people ceased to be Trustees during the year, Barrie Thornton and Hazel Carter. Many thanks to both for their hard work and dedication whist Trustees. Tina Battleday became a Trustee and has quickly become a valued member of the team.

In summary, a busy year with many positives. As usual grateful thanks to all the Trustees, the volunteers and casual helpers who make a great team and, once again, have made for a successful year



Tips For Coping In Hot Weather

Keep out of the heat if you can. If you have to go outside, stay in the shade especially between 11am and 3pm, wear sunscreen, a hat and light clothes, and avoid exercise or activity that makes you hotter.

Cool yourself down. Have cold food and drinks, avoid alcohol, caffeine and hot drinks, and have a cool shower or put cool water on your skin or clothes.

Keep your living space cool. Close windows during the day and open them at night when the temperature outside has gone down. Electric fans can help if the temperature is below 35 degrees. Check the temperature of rooms, especially where people at higher risk live and sleep.

Keeping Pets Cool In Hot Weather

Never leave animals in cars, conservatories, outbuilding or caravans on a hot day. Keep your pets safe by:

- Using a pet-safe sun cream on exposed parts of your pet's skin
- Making sure they have shade
- Giving them constant access to fresh water
- Putting ice cubes in their water bowl
- Giving them damp towels to lie on

Top 10 Gardening Jobs for July & August

July

- 1. Deadhead bedding plants and repeat flowering perennials, to ensure continuous flowering
- 2. Care for houseplants while on holiday
- 3. Water tubs and new plants if dry, but be water-wise
- 4. Check clematis for signs of clematis wilt
- 5. Pick courgettes before they become marrows
- 6. Treat apple scab
- 7. Clear algae, blanket weeds and debris from ponds, and keep them topped up
- 8. Order catalogues for next year's spring flowering bulbs
- 9. Give the lawn a quick acting summer feed, especially if not given a spring feed
- 10. Harvest apricots, peaches and nectarines

August

- 1. Prune wisteria
- 2. Don't delay summer pruning fruits trained as restricted forms
- 3. Deadhead flowering plants regularly
- 4. Water containers and new plants, preferably with grey recycled water or stored rainwater
- 5. Collect seed from garden plants
- 6. Harvest sweetcorn and other vegetables as they become ready
- 7. Continue cutting out old fruited canes on raspberries
- 8. Lift and pot up rooted strawberry runners
- 9. Keep ponds and water features topped up
- 10. Feed the soil with green manures
